The two-week experiential course is designed to help educators develop an understanding of the teaching and learning processes used in the Orff Schulwerk approach to music education. Participants will experience music learning from the perspective of children through movement, recorder playing, improvisation, singing, and playing Orff instruments. The conceptual and pedagogical basis of the Orff Schulwerk approach will also be discussed and experienced as part of the daily schedule.

## WORKSHOP FACULTY:



**Vivian Murray Caputo** is an Orff specialist at Berkshire Country Day School in Lenox, MA, where she teaches music in grades 1-8. She has taught in public schools in New York, Massachusetts, and in Memphis, TN, and has presented workshops for AOSA chapters and for MENC and AOSA national conferences. She has taught Levels I and II at many universities, and will be teaching Level III in Nashville in 2009. She served on the AOSA National Board of Trustees as Region V Representative and as Co-Chair of the 2005 AOSA National Conference in Birmingham. She was Co-Chair of the International Orff Symposium in Rochester, NY, in 2000. She has been an instructor for IAJE Teacher Training Institutes, and she sings with various jazz ensembles. She recently recorded with Phil Woods and the Gregory Caputo Big Band. She continues to explore the many possibilities offered by Orff Schulwerk, and is an avid knitter in her “spare time.” (Basic Pedagogy, Special Topics)

**Anna Marie Spallina** is a teacher, performer and clinician who has conducted numerous workshops and Orff Schulwerk certification courses. She attended Westminster Choir College and the State University of New York at Potsdam, Crane School of Music, and received her Orff certification from the New England Conservatory, Boston. Ms. Spallina has done further Orff Schulwerk study in Salzburg, Austria, Assisi and Urbino, Italy. She is a former faculty member at the Bank Street School for Children in Manhattan, and P. S. 242 in Harlem. Currently, Ms. Spallina teaches general music to pre-K through 4th grade at P. S. 163 in Manhattan. (Recorder, Movement)
