MU Orchestra To Perform in State Capitol During Spring Tour

Kenneth Sarch, Director of Orchestra Activities and String Studies, announced plans for the Mansfield University Symphony Orchestra Annual Spring Tour. The orchestra will travel to Williamsport on Friday, February 25 to perform on the Lycoming College *Noon Concert Series* in Clark Chapel Auditorium. The concert is open to the public as well as the students and faculty of the college. On March 1, the orchestra will travel to Hanover High School to rehearse and perform a combined concert. Hanover Orchestra Director Larry Kuntz will host the MU Orchestra and share the podium with Dr. Sarch. The MU orchestra will continue on

the following day to perform a noon concert at the Pennsylvania State Capitol in Harrisburg at the invitation of PMEA (Pennsylvania Music Educators Association) to perform in the March 2000 Celebration of Music In Our Schools Month. The MU Orchestra will perform a concert in the East Wing Lobby of the Capitol from 12 noon -1 p.m. The MU Symphony is the first university orchestra to be invited by PMEA to play at the Capitol Rotunda Concert Series. Repertory for the tour will be selected from Mozart "Titus" Overture, Cimerosa "Secret Marriage" Overture, Haydn Symphony 104 "London" and Bizet "L'Arlesienne" Suite.

Kenneth Sarch . . .

Kenneth Sarch, Associate Professor of Violin and Viola, and Director of Orchestral Activities, has several distinguished invitations during the spring semester. He was invited to adjudicate for the MTNA (Music Teachers National Association) Regional Competition in strings in Richmond, Virginia on January 29-30. He was a judge for a full day of collegiate strings followed by a day of high school strings. Dr. Sarch served MTNA in the past as National String Program Chair and as the first National Chair of the Collegiate Chamber Music Competition.

The West Virginia Music Educators Association (WVMEA) has invited Dr. Sarch to present two clinics on string teaching and playing at their 2000 WVMEA Conference to be held March 23-25 at Marshall University in Huntington.

The KJOS Music Company in California announced the publication of a second string orchestra work by Dr. Sarch to be released this summer. The work is a setting of a Jordanian folk dance called "Ahlan Sabaya Alfarah," which means "Greetings to

the Beautiful Young Woman who brings us Happiness." Former MU Professor Rob Amchin wrote added Arabic drum and finger cymbal parts to the work. Dr. Sarch composed a first draft of the work during his stay in Amman, Jordan in 1992 while he was teaching and conducting at the Queen Noor Conservatory of Music at the invitation of USIA on an Arts America Grant. Jordanian children performed this earlier version, and Sarch revised it recently to submit for publication. This is Dr. Sarch's second work to be published by KJOS.

18th Annual Jazz Festival

The 18th annual Mansfield University High School Jazz Festival will be held on Saturday, March 25, 2000. Sponsored by the Music Department and the MU chapter of the International Association of Jazz Educators, the festival begins in the morning and adjudication will conclude by late afternoon. The evening concert, which begins at 7:30 p.m., will feature the outstanding high school jazz ensemble, the MU Jazz Ensemble and this year's guest artists, The Mike Holober Quintet featuring Tom Harrell.

All participating groups are encouraged to stay for the entire day. The festival offers young musicians an exciting opportunity to hear other high school jazz bands, as well as college and professional jazz musicians. As usual, the festival will be judged on a non-competitive basis, although awards are presented to outstanding soloists and the outstanding band will be invited to perform at the evening concert. The guest artists will also present an afternoon clinic.

The festival's guest combo is the Mike Holober Quintet, featuring trumpeter Tom Harrell. This is Holober's second visit to the MU Jazz Festival, this time with a completely new quintet. Holober is gaining widespread recognition on the contemporary jazz scene as a versatile pianist and an imaginative composer. He has assembled an all-star quintet for our festival. At the top of the list is trumpeter Tom Harrell. Phil Woods calls him "The best musician I've encountered in 40 years of playing music." Harrell has performed and recorded with the top names in jazz, including Phil Woods, Stan Kenton, Woody Herman, Horace Silver, Gerry Mulligan, Bill Evans, the Mel Lewis Orchestra, Charlie Haden and Lee Konitz.

The rest of the quintet has equally strong credentials. Saxophonist Tim Ries has performed with Dave Liebman, Maynard Ferguson, Freddie Hubbard, Red Garland, Maria Schneider and Donald Byrd. His recording and performance credits include work with such diverse talents as Donald Fagan, Paul Simon, Tony Bennett, Stevie

Wonder, Incognito, Blood Sweat and Tears, Bob Belden, David Lee Roth and The Rolling Stones. Since arriving in New York in 1988, Scott Colley has been one of the most in-demand bassists on the jazz scene, supplying driving momentum behind a variety of players from guitarists Jim Hall, Mike Stern, Pat Metheny and John Scofield to saxophonists Joe Lovano, Joe Henderson and Clifford Jordan, pianists Kenny Werner, Andrew Hill and Fred Hersch, and drummers Brian Blade and Billy Hart. Finally, the quintet's drummer John Riley enjoys a stellar career, including gigs and recordings with artists such as John Scofield, Mike Stern, Woody Herman, Dizzy Gillespie, Stan Getz and Miles Davis. He currently performs regularly with the Vanguard Jazz Orchestra, Bob Mintzer, The Carnegie Hall Jazz Band and Gary Peacock.

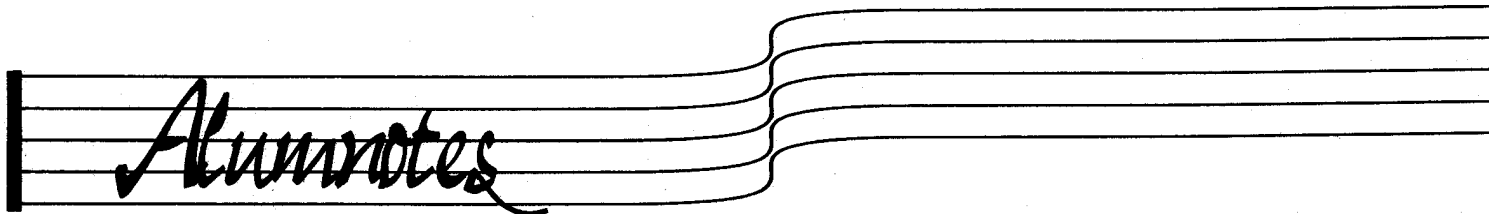
Angie Schmid, Cambridge, MA, continues to play chamber music.

Clarinetist **Patricia Kostek** (BS '74) was just elected to the Mansfield University Music Department Alumni Honor Roll. She is well known across North and South America, and Europe for her critically acclaimed performances, her adjudication of major competitions, her lectures and master classes. She has performed in such international music festivals as the Buenos Aires International Festival, the Music Festival of Florida, the Tanglewood Institute, and ClarinetFest International. Patricia has given recitals and master classes in major cultural centers of Sweden, Poland, Belgium, France, Germany, Canada, the USA, Brazil and Argentina, where she also adjudicated the 1996, 1997 and 1998 Buenos Aires International Competition. In March 1999, she was invited to perform by the city of Morioka, Japan commemorating the 15th anniversary of the founding of the Victoria-Morioka Friendship Society. In September she was the featured soloist in Rio de Janeiro at Encontro IV, the national conference of Brazilian orchestral clarinetists where she also adjudicated the Brazilian Young Artists Competition.

Patricia was a founding member of the Kansas City Chamber Orchestra before emigrating to Canada and has appeared as soloist with this orchestra, performing Copland's *Concerto for Clarinet*, Mozart's *Clarinet Concerto in A major* and the Krommer *Concerto for Two Clarinets and Orchestra*, and Mendelssohn's *Concertpiece for Clarinet and Bass Horn* with Larry Combs of the Chicago Symphony, among other works. A critically acclaimed contemporary music specialist, Patricia has been involved in the commissioning and the premiere performances of new music.

Patricia has an extensive symphonic background, having performed with numerous orchestras including the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, and under the baton of such eminent conductors as Sir George Solti, James Levine, Edo de Waart, Kiril Kondrashin and Simon Rattle.

She is a frequent performer with Chamber Music San Juan, Trio Pacifica, Eine Kleine Summer Music and Concentus Corvinus, a critically acclaimed nonet. Her performances are frequently broadcast by CBC Radio and she has recorded for national Public Radio (U.S.) and Radio Katowice (Poland). She has recently completed her first solo CD, *Songs of the Rubaiyat*, and, in collaboration with other Canadian musicians has recorded the works of composer Murray Adaskin.

Patricia received her MM in clarinet performance from Michigan State University, followed by advanced studies in Europe and in Chicago. She has held teaching positions at the University of Kansas and the University of Missouri-Kansas City. She is past secretary of the International Clarinet Society and a Buffet Artist Clinician. Patricia is Associate Professor at the University of Victoria, British Columbia, Canada, a position she has held since 1988.

While at Mansfield, Patricia studied with clarinet professor Konrad Owens, whom she thanks for his excellent tutelage and guidance. She also wishes to express gratitude for the outstanding education she

received during her four year Bachelor of Science program at Mansfield State.

After graduating from Mansfield in 1978, **Jerry Bachman** writes that "I received a Master's Degree in Jazz Pedagogy from the University of Miami. Following a year of teaching in Tioga Center (NY), I spent 16 years teaching instrumental music in the Johnson City schools, where I formed a select Wind Ensemble, and developed a widely acclaimed Jazz Ensemble, in addition to teaching instrumental lessons and music theory. I received certification as an administrator through SUNY Cortland, and have, since 1997, been Coordinator of Fine and Performing Arts for the Union-Endicott Schools. Over the years, I've been active as a performer on drumset, keyboards, and trumpet, as an arranger for school and professional jazz and commercial ensembles throughout the region, and as a guest conductor and adjudicator. My wife Sue (also a music educator), our six-year-old son Matthew, and I live in Apalachin, NY. I've followed, with interest and pride, the professional and personal accomplishments of many of the old "MSC" gang, and would love to hear from any of you. Mozart Requiem Performances In Memory of Edward Brown

The Festival Chorus will present "Requiem" by Amadeus Mozart on Saturday, April 8, at 8 p.m. and Sunday, April 9, at 3 p.m. in Steadman Theatre. The concerts will be dedicated to the memory of Mr. Edward Brown, Professor of Theory and Piano at Mansfield from 1971 to 1998, and will feature Jennifer Schmid, soprano; Fran Shumway, mezzo-soprano; William Cutter, tenor, and Thomas Jones, bass. (All soloists are MU alums or connected to the university in other ways.) A large orchestra of student and professional players will accompany the soloists and chorus.

Membership in the MU Festival Chorus numbers well over 100 singers including faculty, students, and staff from the university as well as singers from the surrounding communities. The chorus has performed such masterpieces as Verdi's "Requiem," Handel's "Messiah," Orff's "Carmina Burana," and Haydn's "Creation."

Mozart's "Requiem," the composer's last and unfinished work is known to the

general public in the version undertaken immediately after Mozart's death by his pupil, Franz Xaver Süssmayr. Musicians have studied the work for years, speculating on the parts that came from Mozart's pen and those that may have not. Robert Levin, a musician and historian from Harvard University who has deeply immersed himself in Mozart's music, completed the version the chorus will perform.

Dr. Dettwiler was privileged to study the work at the Oregon Bach Festival this past

summer under Helmut Rilling, renowned conductor from Germany, with Robert Levin at his side, in a masterclass of 14 professional conductors from six countries around the world. During the two-week festival, she conducted excerpts of the "Requiem" in two concert performances.

Tickets are \$5 for adults and senior citizens, and \$3 for children. They are available through the Music Department by calling (570) 662-4710. All proceeds will benefit the Edward Brown Memorial Scholarship Fund.
